1. Statement of Intent

- Arundel Court Primary Academy believes that a consistent school uniform policy is vital to promote the ethos of the school and provide a sense of belonging and identity for all pupils, regardless of their protected characteristics or socio-economic circumstances. This policy lays out the measures the school has taken to ensure a consistent, fair, and inclusive uniform policy.
- 2. We believe that pupils learn most effectively and achieve their best outcomes when they are comfortable, able to be themselves, and dressed in such a way that sets an appropriate tone for education.

3. Legal Framework

- This policy has due regard to all relevant legislation, including but not limited to:
 - Education and Inspections Act 2006
 - Education Act 2011
 - Human Rights Act 1998
 - Equality Act 2010
 - The UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR)
 - Data Protection Act 2018
- It also considers relevant guidance, such as:
 - DfE (2021) 'Cost of school uniforms'
 - DfE (2021) 'School Admissions Code'
 - DfE (2024) 'Developing school uniform policy'

4. Roles and Responsibilities

- **Governing Body:**
 - Establishing, in consultation with the Head Teacher and school community, a practical and smart school uniform that accurately reflects the school's vision and values.
 - Ensuring that the school's uniform is accessible and inclusive, without disadvantaging any pupil based on protected characteristics or socio-economic status.
 - Demonstrating best value for money in the uniform policy.
- **Head Teacher:**
 - Enforcing the school's uniform on a day-to-day basis.
 - Listening to opinions and making appropriate recommendations to the governing body.
- **Staff Members:**
 - Ensuring pupils dress in accordance with this policy.
 - Supporting pupils who are in breach of this policy.
- **Parents:**
 - Providing their children with the correct school uniform as detailed in this policy.

5. Additional Considerations

- **Cost Principles:**
 - Ensuring affordability for families.
 - Compliance with the DfE's 'Cost of school uniforms' guidance.
 - To ensure that all children are able to wear school uniform Arundel Court Primary Academy does not insist that children wear items with the school logo.
- **Equality Principles:**
 - Securing equality of treatment between pupils of different sexes, genders, ethnic backgrounds, religious backgrounds, and pupils with SEND.
 - The school acknowledges that necessary adaptations may need to be made to the uniform to accommodate individual pupils.
- **Second hand uniform:**
 - Access to affordable clothing
 - School runs a second hand uniform shop.
- **Complaints and Challenges:**
 - Addressing any concerns related to the uniform policy.
 - Any concerns with the uniform policy should be addressed to the Head Teacher in the first instance.
- **School Uniform Supplier:**
 - Ensuring accessibility and affordability.
 - Jumpers and Cardigans
 - Arundel Court Primary Academy logo jumpers and cardigans can be purchased online from Brigade Clothing.
 - Children can also wear plain royal blue jumpers available from High Street clothes shops and supermarkets.
 - PE T-shirts
 - Arundel Court Primary Academy logo yellow PE T-shirts can be purchased online from Brigade Clothing.
 - Children can also wear plain yellow t-shirts available from clothes shops and supermarkets.
- **Adverse Weather:**
 - Guidelines for different weather conditions.
 - Children should have a coat for cold and wet weather.
 - Children may wear wellington boots to school and change into school shoes once in the building.
 - Children should have a hat for hot sunny weather.
- **Labelling:**
 - Ensuring all pupils' belongings are labelled with both their first name and surname.
- **Monitoring and Review:**
 - Regularly reviewing and updating the policy.
